


MARRIED AT THE MANSION

A ROOM WITH A VIEW



The Theatre Room is an art deco inspired part of the Georgian Mansion House, added to the building in the 1940s. Following the 2019 refurbishment, the room is now a beautiful event space that can be transformed to suit all tastes.

Perfect for both ceremonies and receptions, the Theatre Room comfortably holds up to 100 ceremony and wedding breakfast guests and offers additional capacity for evening receptions.

Capacities at a glance

Seated: 108 Evening: depending on venue layout, capacity is varied. Options for increased capacity are available with marquee hire.

In a nod to its past life as an open air theatre, a design feature of the Theatre Room is the line of bi-folding doors that offer uninterrupted views out to the secret garden and private terrace at the rear of the House.



MAKE YOURSELF AT HOME

Located on the ground floor are three beautiful Reading Rooms, which can be made available on your big day if you require additional space for guests to freshen up, or for safe storage in the evening. Our Reading Rooms are also licensed to hold smaller, intimate ceremonies.





BRINGING THE OUTSIDE IN

For larger parties in need of additional space, slide back the bi-folding doors of the Theatre Room and take the sweeping staircase out into the Mansion House's magical secret garden.

There's also plenty of room for a marquee if you're looking for that extra wow factor.

In the garden, guests can take in the beauty of the parkland as they sip a welcome drink or meander along the path to the glass enclosure where the Neolithic Calder Stones, which give the local area its name, are housed.

As old as Stonehenge, the 5,000 year-old Calder Stones are one of the UK's most significant ancient monuments and offer a unique backdrop to your celebration.

The Reader

Car parking:

There are free parking spaces at three points in the park: two car parks at the Calderstones Road entrance adjacent to Cromptons Lane, and a third at the Yewtree Road entrance. The nearest accessible car park and drop off point can be reached from the Calderstones Road entrance.

Access information and facilities:

Every floor of the Mansion House is accessible to wheelchair users via a lift. Accessible toilets are available on every level. Baby changing facilities are available on the ground floor.
